

THE BENEFIT SYSTEM AND DISABLED YOUNG PEOPLE

NB: This leaflet applies to people who claimed Incapacity Benefit before 27 October 2008. If claiming for the first time after that date, see PB11ESA

A brief introduction to the Social Security Benefits available to young people who are unable to work, and their carers. For benefits when working – see our leaflet Pb12A.

The benefits that can be claimed can be divided into:

A FROM THE AGE OF SIXTEEN and **B** AT ANY TIME

A FROM THE AGE OF SIXTEEN

A1	INCAPACITY BENEFIT (IB)	CLAIM ON FORM IB(Y)1
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IB is paid to anyone aged 16 and over who passes the “Personal Capability Assessment” (PCA) – the test of who is incapable of work.

Some young people will automatically pass the “PCA”, for example those with a severe learning disability. Initially the claim form has to be accompanied by a Med 3 from your GP; then the assessment is via a form called an IB50.

IB can be claimed whilst still at special school.

See our leaflet Pb12A for the benefits if the young person wants to work.

A2	INCOME SUPPORT	CLAIM ON FORM A1
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The basic benefit for anyone on a low income and who has savings under £16,000. It tops up other income, such as IB, especially if DLA (overleaf) is also being paid. Check whether this applies to you now or in the future.

Entitlement to Income Support triggers entitlement to -

- * Free school meals
- * Free NHS Benefits (e.g. prescriptions, dental care, glasses, hospital fares)
- * Community Care Grants (payments for one-off needs)

Income Support can be claimed even if at school. Usually the young person will also need to be on DLA / IB, or, you will need to get a note from a doctor saying that your child has been ‘unfit for work’ for the past 28 weeks.

TO CLAIM: For both Incapacity Benefit and Income Support, contact the Under 18 Officer at your local Jobcentre Plus (if aged 16/17), otherwise call 0800 055 6688.

PARENTS – Once your child claims Incapacity Benefit or Income Support in their own right they are no longer your ‘dependants’ for benefit purposes and so you will not be able to claim for them on your benefits such as Child Tax Credit or Child Benefit - you must notify the Child Benefit Centre and Child Tax Credit Office.

B CLAIM AT ANY TIME

B1	DISABILITY LIVING ALLOWANCE	CLAIM FORM DLA(1)A
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Split into two components - CARE and MOBILITY – both can be claimed at the same time.

● CARE COMPONENT

The Care Component is paid at 3 rates - **HIGHER, MIDDLE and LOWER** so it covers a wide range of care needs.

The **higher** rate is for people who need 24 hour care. The **middle** rate is for those who need help either throughout the day or for long periods / more than once at night.

This Component is for people who need a high degree of looking after. This can be actually doing something practical for them or keeping an eye on them - or a combination of the two.

The **lower** rate is for those who only need help for a part of the day, for example for about an hour in total or those who cannot prepare a cooked main meal on their own.

If help is needed - for example getting dressed or undressed, using the toilet, washing, having a bath, taking medication or if the person is unsafe to be left alone - make a claim for the Care Component of the DLA.

● MOBILITY COMPONENT

The Mobility Component is paid at two rates – **HIGHER** (aged 3 and over) and **LOWER** (aged 5 and over).

The **LOWER RATE** is for the young person who is able to walk but who needs guidance or supervision when outside. S/he might be able to cope with walking in their own local environment, but need help when outside their familiar routes. Examples would be those with a visual impairment, behavioural problems, communication difficulties or having fits.

The **HIGHER RATE** is for anyone who has walking problems and can be considered “virtually unable to walk” – this takes into account the speed, distance, time taken and how they walk. It is **also** payable to someone who has both severe behavioural problems and who needs 24 hour care.

People in receipt of the higher rate are entitled to a blue badge, free car tax and can use the allowance to obtain a car via “Motability”.

APPEALS There is a right of appeal against either being refused the Care or Mobility Component completely or if only a lower rate is given.

B2 CARERS ALLOWANCE**CLAIM FORM DS 700**

This is for a carer who looks after someone on the Higher or Middle rate of the Care Component of the Disability Living Allowance (so DLA and Carers Allowance can be claimed at the same time). The carer has to be aged 16 or over. S/he can work while claiming, but there is an earnings limit, which increases yearly **so get up to date advice on Carers Allowance (CA).**

B3 INCOME RELATED HELP FOR CARERS

Carers on a low income and savings may get one or more of the following:

- * Income Support/Pension Credit/JSA (income-based)
- * Child Tax Credit
- * Rent Rebate (Housing Benefit - HB)
- * Council Tax Rebate (Council Tax Benefit - CTB)

Getting Carers Allowance triggers extra help which is called the 'Carers Premium' or 'Addition'. This is added to the above benefits when the Carer is eligible for Carers Allowance.

There will also be entitlement to the Carers Premium/Addition if the only reason Carers Allowance is not in payment is the Carer is either already on another "overlapping" benefit (e.g. Retirement Pension) or s/he is part of someone else's claim as a dependant (e.g. Incapacity Benefit).

To get the Carers Premium/Addition with your benefits contact your local Jobcentre Plus (for Income Support/JSA(IB)), Pension Service (for Pension Credit) or the Benefits Section of the Local Council (for HB/CTB).

Your local advice agency can help with this claim.

B4 OTHER HELP – Whatever your income or savings**(i) COUNCIL TAX DISABILITY REDUCTION**

If the young person's home has been adapted, or added to, because of their disability, the Council Tax payer may be entitled to a DISABILITY REDUCTION. This could mean a lower gross Council Tax bill.

(ii) COUNCIL TAX DISCOUNT

A discount can reduce the gross Council Tax by up to a half. Certain categories of Carers are entitled to a discount, as are households where there is a person who is "severely mentally impaired".

Apply for a disability reduction or a discount from your Council Tax Section.

- * JOBCENTRE PLUS - address and number in the telephone book.

PLEASE NOTE

For most benefits for people of working age (not DLA) the claim has to be via your Jobcentre Plus office and will mean an interview with a "Personal Adviser".
